During the past few weeks we have implemented mandatory sign-in sheets at the main entrance for all visitors to the care home to increase resident and staff safety. As part of this, we also ask visitors to include their license plate if they are parked in the care home parking lot to encourage compliance with parking regulations and to grant access to handicap parking spots for those who need them. During the summer months, several exterior doors will remain open until 9pm.

Room Service Menu

Last year, we conducted a survey asking for residents' and families' opinions about the food we offer at the care home. Many great suggestions were made that inspired us to implement a Room Service Menu. Residents now have the opportunity to order a few specific food items whenever they feel like having a small meal or snack.

This addition to our services has become surprisingly popular among our residents. We are continuously tracking the orders and evaluating the feedback.
